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<p>N/A</p>	<p>Zoonosis – ANIMALS BIOLOGICAL AGENTS BIOLOGICAL ARTEFACTS</p>	<p>1-9</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> •No visitors will come into contact with animals likely to transmit disease. •All animal exhibits are kept clean. •Hand wash facilities and antibacterial gel dispensers are located around the Zoo. •For taught sessions involving animal contact students will be briefed and supervised by zoo staff/volunteers. •Teachers are responsible for ensuring that all children/students wash their hands after leaving an exhibit or encounter before they consume any food or drink. •All reptiles used for handling are regularly health screened. •Children under 24 months old and pregnant persons should not touch animals. •Teachers should ensure that any existing cuts or grazes are dressed appropriately. Students/teachers should not handle any animals if they have an open wound. •If any of your group fall ill after visiting the centre it would be advisable to seek medical advice and explain that you have visited the centre and they should consider zoonosis with their diagnosis. •Visitors may only feed animals in designated areas. 	<p>L</p>	<p>YES</p>

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
N/A	<p>Lost children -</p> <p>WELFARE SECURITY VIOLENCE/AGGRESSION STRESS</p>	1-9	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> •Supervisors and teachers are responsible for keeping their groups of children together. •It is recommended that a head count is done upon leaving each exhibit or building. •Lost children must be reported immediately to a member of staff. •All staff carry radios so that they can alert other team members and begin a search for the missing person immediately. •It is recommended that prior to their visit teachers agree a meeting place (e.g. zoo shop) with children /students in the event of their becoming lost or separated from their group. •Staff are visible around the centre and can be contacted if a child is lost. N/A	Dangerous animal escape - DANGEROUS ANIMALS ANIMALS NOISE STRESS	1-9	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> •Animal escape procedure & policy established, with regular drills carried out. •All staff are in radio contact in case of emergencies. •In the event of a dangerous animal escape instructions given by the zoo staff must be followed. •If evacuated into a building, teachers should ensure all group members stay inside and keep doors and windows closed until a member of zoo staff says it is safe to exit. •Teachers are requested to report any missing members of your group immediately to a member of staff. •Never try to help catch an animal that has escaped! You could put yourself in danger, our team of keepers have specialist training to deal with animal escapes; this could be hindered by visitors trying to help. •Safe working practices are in place and enclosures are inspected daily to ensure that they are in good, safe working order. Code of Conduct for Visiting Groups

We want you all to have an enjoyable visit to the IOW Zoo. Please remember that this is our animals' home. They can be distressed by loud and excitable behaviour so please ensure that you move around the zoo calmly.

Behaviour, discipline and welfare of students are the responsibility of the group leader at all times whilst inside the zoo.

Educational groups are required to bring a minimum of 1 member of staff per 10 students.

We ask that you observe this adult-student ratio at all times in the zoo. Failure to observe this rule may result in the group being requested to leave without refund.

No student is to be left unaccompanied during your visit. All students must be closely supervised at all times.

Please report accidents or emergencies to the gift shop staff.

Equipment in the play area is designed for young children and should be treated with respect. Group leaders are requested to limit the number of children using the equipment at any one time and to supervise them closely to avoid accidents and breakage.

Please share these important rules with your students:

- Please stay with an adult at all times.
- Please remain behind safety barriers. Do not climb onto or over them.
- Please show respect to the animals. Do not shout at them, poke them or throw things at them.
- Please also show respect to other visitors. They want to have a nice day out, too.
- Please do not feed the animals - this can make them ill.
- Walk, don't run - to avoid accidents. Running also distresses the animals.
- If you touch any of the animals in the animal encounter zones wash your hands afterwards to prevent the transfer of disease.
